20. People become a sinner when they sin? True or False? False.
21. In Romans 5:23 it says, "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." What is "the glory of God"? His absolute sinless-ness and perfection.
22. There are two kinds of spiritual death that affect two groups of people. Define who is affected, and how.
 1. The saved – spiritually dead by quenching the Holy Spirit, concerning their spiritual behavior.
 2. The Lost – Rejects Christ, no Holy Spirit; therefore, Hell is their home.
23. There are 3 basic proofs that all mankind has sinned. What are they?
 1. God declares it – Romans 3:23
 2. The perfect law of God proves it – James 2:10
 3. Man, himself, exhibits it.

28. I John 3:9 reads, “Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God.” Predestinationalist people say the word “commit” means “keep on practicing sin.” In other words, if you are a true Christian, you will not keep on practicing sin. In refutation of this false doctrine, answer the following:

- (1). This false teaching would contradict what Scripture? I John 1:8,10.
- (2). We know the usual Greek word for “practicing or keep on committing sin” is “Prasso”; BUT, that is not the Greek word used here for “commit.” Rather, it is the Greek “POIEO” and means: Not to commit one single act of sin.
- (3). The “seed” in this verse is referring to: The Holy Spirit.
- (4). This verse teaches a practical truth or a positional truth? Positional.
- (5). Give a practical example showing a Christian can continue in sin unto death.
