- 11. Verse 8 "Charity never faileth."
  - a. Define "charity." Greek <u>"agape" love</u>.
  - b. Define "faileth." "never drop away."
- 12. Verse 8 "Prophecies they shall fail."
  - a. Define "fail." The Greek is "katargeo" and means "be abolished."
  - b. Define "prophecies." Giving forth by speaking God's Word given to Mankind.
- 13. Verse 8 "Tongues they shall cease."
  - a. Define "Cease." <u>Is the Greek "pauo" and means, "come to a complete stop.</u>
- 14. Verse 8 "Knowledge, it shall vanish away."
  - a. Define "Vanish away." <u>Greek is "katargeo," the same as "fail" reference propecies</u> and means "to be abolished."
- 15. Verse 9 "For we know in part."
  - a. Define "in part." A portion of the whole.
